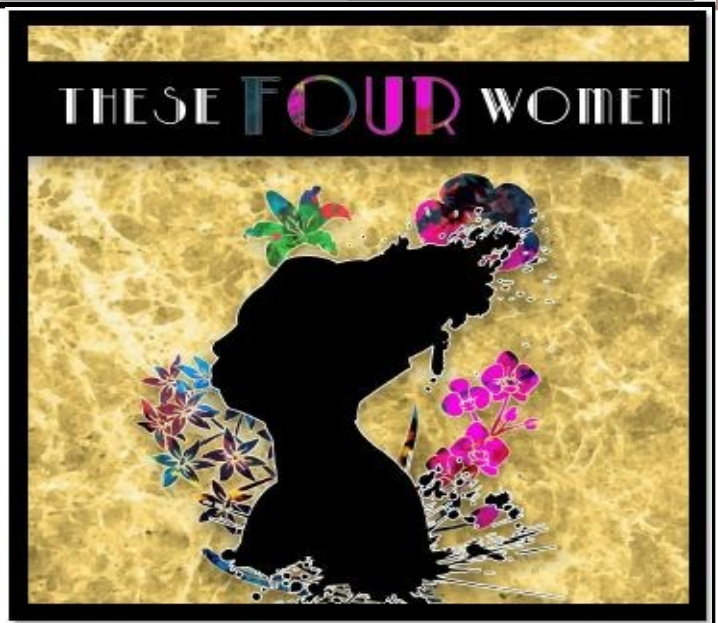

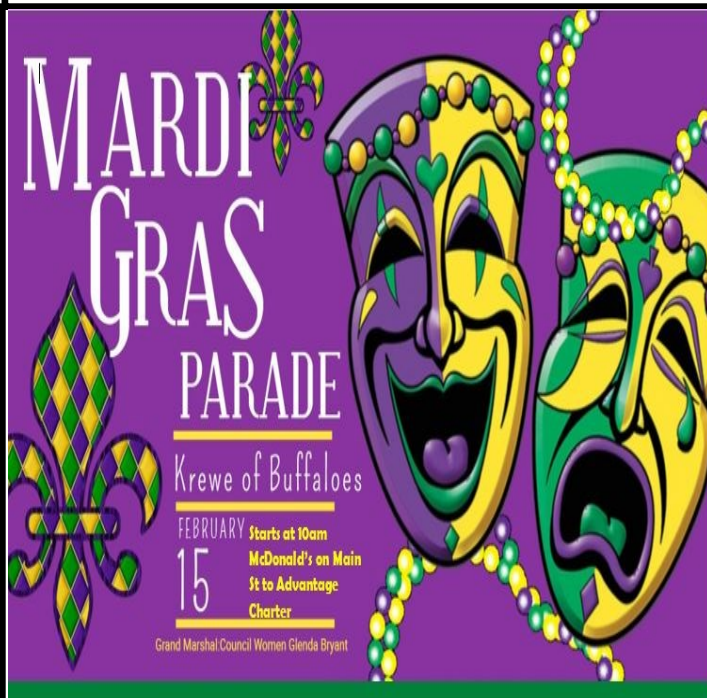

CITY OF BAKER APPLIED FOR AND RECEIVED SOME FUNDING TO ADDRESS SURFACE DRAINAGE, FLOODING & FLOOD PROOFING

The City of Baker has applied for nine hazard mitigation grants (HMGP) totaling over \$7 million to improve disaster-preparedness and resilience. They address surface drainage and flooding, protection of the city's water supply, prevention of property damage, and flood proofing city buildings that house our emergency operations center (EOC) and emergency shelter.

Phase one funding of two drainage projects have been approved. The North Canal Project addresses flooding in the northern portion of our city from Baker Boulevard past the northern border of our city. The Bozeman Creek drainage project addressed head and back-water in the areas that flooded Lavey Lane and Plank Road.

Three generator projects have been approved that protect our citywide well water, maintain functionality of seven sewer lift stations and provide emergency power the City of Baker's emergency shelter. Work on the generator projects began in December 2019. Implementation of the HMGP grant projects will improve Baker's flood/emergency readiness and reduce recovery time from future disasters.

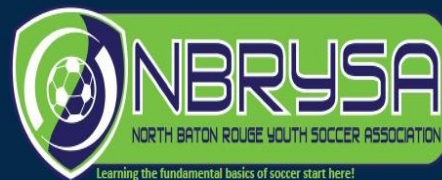
